Training for Adoption Competency (TAC™)

is a postgraduate curriculum created by the Center for Adoption Support and Education (C.A.S.E.™) with the assistance of a national Advisory Board of experts in child welfare, adoption and mental health as well as individuals with lived experience.

TAC is accredited by the Institute for Credentialing Excellence. It is a comprehensive, evidence-based training designed exclusively for licensed mental health professionals, providing clinical knowledge and skills needed to effectively serve the adoption kinship network.

Through classroom and remote instruction as well as clinical case consultation, the TAC program students master 18 areas of knowledge, values and skills that are critical to adoption competent mental health services.

The TAC program is designed to increase access to adoption competent mental health for all members of the adoption kinship network and to improve the well-being of adopted children and their foster, adoptive, or guardianship families.

TAC training produces more effective clinical practice and better outcomes with adoptive families.* Families treated by TAC trained clinicians:

- were significantly more satisfied overall, with clinician performance, and with child and family outcomes.
- reported significantly more positive outcomes for their families on measures of communication openness, adoption knowledge, relationships, and parenting skills and for their child on measures of daily functioning and relationships.

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LEARNING OBJECTIVES

TAC program participants will:

Identify appropriate evidence-based and evidence-informed practices and interventions with individuals affected by adoption.

Incorporate learning into clinical practice more rapidly through the case consultation process.

Advance clinical skills in working with children and youth and their adoptive and birth families on:

- issues of loss, grief, separation, identity formation and attachment.
- the impact of past experiences on adjustment and the psychological well-being of adopted children.
- issues of adoption openness and ongoing connections.

The TAC program includes CEs, certificate of completion, digital badging and national recognition in the Directory of TAC Trained Mental Health Providers.



The TAC program is a nationally recognized, evidence-based, postgraduate training program for licensed clinicians who work with adoptive families in a broad range of settings.

Understand

- how trauma impacts children and the tools and techniques to support recovery from adverse beginnings.
- the issues that impact identity formation for adopted youth and young adults.

Learn

- how to support adoptive parents in developing therapeutic parenting strategies in response to their children's developmental and behavioral challenges.
- how to work effectively with service systems and community supports on behalf of adoptive families.
- the developmental stages of adoptive families and the process of adoptive family formation and integration.

Develop

- assessment and intervention skills with different types of adoptive families and with birth families.
- an understanding of the racial, ethnic, and cultural issues in adoption and how to work with families who adopt transracially/transculturally.

The TAC program is subject to ongoing, rigorous evaluation designed to assess training delivery, outcomes, and effectiveness:

- Training delivery is assessed using fidelity observations and feedback on each of the modules from participants and trainers.
- Training outcomes are assessed using pre- and post-training self-assessments of adoption competency and surveys reporting changes in clinical practices at the midpoint and conclusion of training.
- Training effectiveness is assessed using a pre- and post-test administered to training participants and a comparison group of comparably qualified clinicians.
- In addition, the longer-term impacts of training on clinical practices are assessed in post-training follow-up surveys and interviews.

 **APPROACH**

Rated as a promising practice with high relevance for child welfare by the California Evidence-based Clearinghouse for Child Welfare.

Data from participants and from trainers are collected online and findings are systematically used to ensure training is delivered effectively and content remains highest quality.
